THE CHALLENGE

**committed young leaders
face systemic barriers**

Across Latin America, thousands of young people are already taking action to protect their seas, rivers, forests and communities.

They bring talent, creativity, and deep commitment to conservation — but often face structural barriers that limit their impact.

Most lack access to holistic, hands-on training in conservation management tailored to their local contexts. Opportunities for funding, visibility, and mentorship are rare. Many feel isolated, without networks or guidance to grow their ideas into sustainable initiatives.

And most conservation training programs are expensive, only offered in English, or disconnected from the realities of conservation in Latin America.

Aceleradores por Naturaleza (AxN) exists to bring holistic conservation management training to early-career Latin American changemakers.





OUR SOLUTION

Aceleradores por Naturaleza (AxN) is a free, online, Spanish-language course that empowers young conservationists to transform their ideas into real, impactful projects.

In a holistic course that combines conservation management tools with key soft skills, participants receive hands-on training, mentoring and access to a growing community of peers across the region. The intensive program spans 15 weeks, with all modules taught live, covering both theory and practical components.

In 2025, a comprehensive impact assessment showed that the course has a transformative impact on the professional development of early-career conservationists.

OUR STRATEGY

We envision a community of empowered young changemakers driving lasting conservation impact across Latin America. Our approach is based in three pillars:

1. Practical skills for real-world impact

We equip early-career professionals with the tools they need to turn ideas into action.

2. A growing community of changemakers

We build a connected network of peers who inspire and support each other.

3. Mentoring that empowers and guide

We facilitate one-on-one intergenerational exchange rooted in trust, purpose, and direction.

PRACTICAL SKILLS FOR REAL-WORLD IMPACT

Young leaders often enter the conservation field full of passion, but without the technical tools to plan, implement, and communicate their initiatives effectively. **AxN fills that gap through a comprehensive curriculum that blends theory with practice.**

What participants learn:

- **Understand** conservation challenges through a systems thinking lens, including situational analyses, gender and intercultural contexts, and policy
- **Design** impactful solutions using Theory of Change, SMART goals, and logical frameworks
- **Implement** projects with real-world tools: budgeting, leadership, and conflict resolution using non-violent communication
- **Communicate** effectively through strategy, storytelling, and public speaking

A GROWING COMMUNITY OF CHANGEMAKERS

Learning is stronger when it's shared. We believe conservation requires not only knowledge, but connection.

AxN fosters a regional community of young leaders who support one another, collaborate, and grow together beyond the course.

Through our alumni network, we:

- Host virtual events on soft skills and leadership
- Share funding, job, and scholarship opportunities
- Provide a platform for exchange on project ideas and conservation challenges.
- Maintain ongoing support from the CxN team

3. MENTORSHIP THAT EMPOWERS AND GUIDES

Growth takes more than content — early-career conservation professionals need role models from Latin America that inspire and guide.

Our voluntary mentorship program connects fellows with **experienced conservation professionals who offer technical guidance and professional support.**

What we offer:

- At least three personalized sessions with a mentor during the course
- Feedback on project design, pitches, and professional development
- Intergenerational exchange that fosters learning and inspiration for both mentee and mentor.

A POWERFUL IMPACT

AxN fellows are currently leading their own projects and initiatives, empowered by the course.

- **Melissa Ramos - Peru**
After the course, Melissa led a community-based initiative that supports six farming communities in San Martín in protecting over 7,000 hectares of forest. Her team promotes ecotourism, monitoring, and water access, benefiting more than 6,500 people.
- **Sarai Cortez - Peru**
Sarai co-founded Proyecto Cetáceos Perú to promote sustainable whale watching. With her course project, she trains tour operators in conservation practices and data collection to protect humpback whales and boost local livelihoods.
- **Rocío Contreras - Chile**
Rocío works to protect the endangered Darwin's fox in southern Chile. Through her project, developed during the course, she engages dog owners near protected areas to reduce threats and safeguard the species' habitat.
